

FINAL REMINDERS

The Broadbridge family is excited for our one week session for young campers. The past one week sessions were such a success that almost all of last year's boys have returned this year for longer sessions. This session will provide your son with the opportunity to experience the excitement Deerhorn has offered for 79 years. Here are some important reminders that you will need to keep in mind as you get your son ready to attend Deerhorn.

Campers are not allowed to receive phone calls at camp unless it is a special occasion such as a birthday. Parents are welcome to call a Director anytime regarding their son. Due to the short length of this session, we recommend that parents mail their son a letter several days before they arrive at Deerhorn. Please do not send any food, candy, gum, squirt toys, or water balloons to your son.

Campers are allowed to receive e-mails at the cost of \$1 each if the e-mail is sent to camper@deerhorn.com. Their first and last name must appear in the subject line, and no attachments are accepted. Please send one or two, self addressed, stamped envelopes with your son so he can write you.

Spending Money: Deerhorn recommends that parents send a **\$25 check written out to the camper's name**. He will be able to endorse the check and use it for camp store items such as film and batteries. Campers will be permitted to purchase one drink and/or candy bar after lunch each day. The balance in each boy's account will be mailed home at the end of his session. If he wants to buy clothing while he is here, he will need additional funds in his account.

Baggage, Laundry, Lost and Found: Please ensure that every single item your son brings to camp has his name on it, including shoes, mitts, baggage, and tennis racquets. Deerhorn cannot be responsible for articles left or lost at camp. For the one week session it is recommended that the boys use a large suitcase or small footlocker(13"H x 20"D x 32"L). Boys will also need a large laundry bag and a duffle bag for their sheets, blankets, and pillow.

Safety: While Deerhorn has an exemplary safety record and is well known for its competent and compassionate staff, we can never put too many safeguards in place when it comes to your children. Please make sure your son knows that he should contact a Broadbridge if he ever has a concern that his counselor has not rectified. It is strictly forbidden for boys to have ammunition, arrows, matches, flammables, or weapons, including pocket knives. Your child should know that "whatever is not allowed at school, is not allowed at camp".

Visitation: Parents are invited to visit at any time, but are required to check in at the office upon arrival. Due to the short length of this session, it is not recommended that campers have visitors and they will not be allowed to leave camp with anyone other than their parents.

Schedule: Although families are welcome to spend time touring camp, we are not able to accommodate family members in our dining rooms. If you drop off or pick up your child, please do not bring your family pets. Campers should arrive after 9:30A.M. the first day of the session. Deerhorn will provide transportation from Wilmette to Camp Deerhorn and back if a reservation is made by June 16. The transportation will leave the parking lot of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, at 2727 Lake Ave. at 9:00 A.M. on the first day and return at approximately 5:30P.M. on the last day of the session. The cost for Deerhorn transportation is \$160 round trip and \$100 one way. Boys using Deerhorn transportation should pack in a large suitcase, not a trunk. Transportation will include a Suburban or minivan on the way to camp and a chartered bus on the way home from camp.

****IMPORTANT!-Please Note:** If you are picking your son up on the last day of the session, we would ask that you arrive after 10:30A.M. Boys will be enjoying a final morning of activities on the last day of the session.

Misc.:

* All campers attend our nondenominational (inspirational message) service on Sundays. If you would like your son to attend **Catholic Mass on Sunday, please send a note to camp.**

* Inline skating is an optional free time activity. If your son would like to inline skate he will need to bring his skates, mouth guard, elbow, knee, and wrist pads. Deerhorn provides sticks, pucks, and helmets.

* Boys are placed in cabins with boys of similar age. Any cabin requests must be received by June 15.

* Any boy needing medication during his stay should contact the Camp Healthcare supervisor upon arrival at Camp.

* If you have not returned the health form or tuition check please do so immediately. Thank you for sharing your son with us this summer!
